Chairman's Corner - Axioms to live by.

As Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons, we have the moral code: Nonmaleficence, beneficence, autonomy and justice. Patients often ask, "If I were your mother/father, what would you do?". Thus the axiom: "When we put patients first, everything will be ok". The principle removes financial motives, political agendas, professional and research goals. It crystalizes a sharp point of focus that we wield every day.

In the interim, the department and chair have been guided by the corollary axiom. "When we put the residents first, then everything will be ok". To that end we have been busy.

We graduated four wonderful physicians: Sam Clarot, Mike Hironaka, Zack Scogin and Travis Williams. They voiced gratefulness to our collective work at LSU. It is the cumulative efforts of the LSU alumni who have solidified standing in the health system: your sleepless nights wiring mandibles continue to mean a great deal to the decision makers at LSU.

We added new faculty to support a significant need in our department: Dr John Kent III and Dr Edward Massett. Specifically, the quantity and quality of education for oral surgery sedation. Bolstered by Dr Brian Dyess in Baton Rouge, we are redirecting our outpatient focus to address this accreditation imperative.

Our goal to augment the sedation experience does not detract from LSU's core foundation that was discussed in Winter 2022. The Orthognathic service is more vibrant than ever. Our pathology service will have its strongest year in a decade. The consistency of dental implant surgery has improved under the service line leadership of Dale Misiek. The trauma volume is drastically increasing as the Greater New Orleans population and tourists interact, disagree and, unfortunately, pursue physical methods of resolving conflict.

We are looking for additional faculty. A current advertisement is out for a full time faculty in New Orleans to address our increasing major case volume. But, also, we will begin our Chair search. To that end, we have had several discussions with the current Interim Dean and Future Dean. Alumni should rest assured that the school understands the gravity of the LSU OMS Chair. Our destinies are irrevocably intertwined. The administration will look for surgical acumen, research credentials, but most importantly, a history of effective administration. A mentor for the faculty, residents and students alike. To find another Dr Jack Kent is to capture lightning in a bottle; we will not lose our resolve.

Finally, I want to thank the JKOMS Foundation for agreeing to a sizable donation to our residents. We need to run our normal operations by taking tests, getting licensure, going to courses, buying study materials. For 24 residents, this requires money and Foundation has stepped up to our aid. We are grateful.

In conclusion, thank you for all the well wishes and mentorship over the last several months. Surely, as long as we are guided by the chair's axiom, putting the residents first, our department will always thrive.

Dr. Angelo J. Mariotti has agreed to serve as the next dean of the LSU Health School of Dentistry effective January 2023. Our deepest gratitude to Dr. Sandra Andrieu for her tireless commitment, grace and wisdom in leading the school as interim dean through this transition period.



As professor and chair of the Department of Periodontology at The Ohio State University College of Dentistry, Dr. Mariotti was instrumental in transforming the curriculum, increasing educational outcomes at both pre- and post-doctoral levels, increasing fundraising, improving facilities, building research, expanding clinics, and enhancing faculty development. He will bring this proven success to benefit the School of Dentistry in collaboration with faculty, students, staff, alumni, and external partners.

Dr. Mariotti is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists, American College of Dentists and the Pierre Fauchard Academy. He is both a Diplomate and Director of the American Board of Periodontology. He is an editor of *Pharmacology and Therapeutics for Dentistry*. His more than 100 articles in peer-reviewed journals and textbooks focus on the pharmacologic actions of agents in the oral cavity and topics related to dental health care economics. Dr. Mariotti has served in a variety of leadership positions for numerous national and international dentistry organizations, all the while maintaining an active clinical practice in periodontology. Dr. Mariotti received his B.S. in biology and education from Grove City College, a Ph.D. in Pharmacology & Toxicology from West Virginia University, a D.D.S. from West Virginia University, and specialty training in periodontology from the Medical College of Virginia.

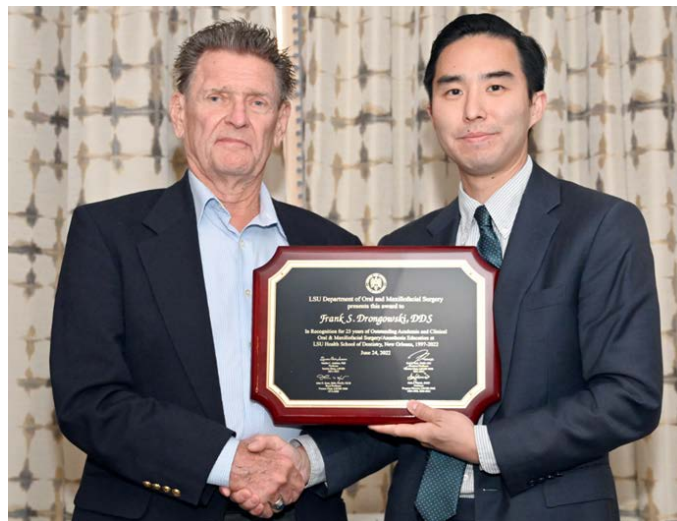

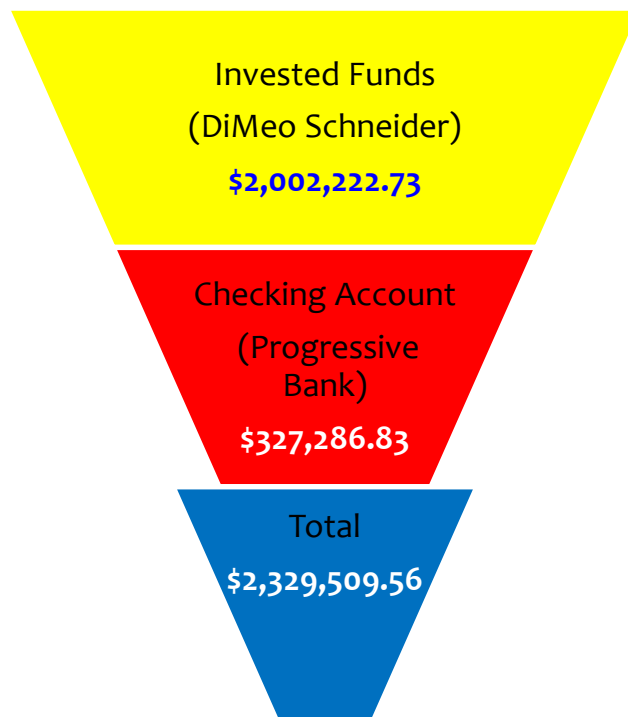
Greetings to all, and hope that everyone is doing well during these “dog days of summer.” Your JKOMSF Board of Directors have been very busy working with Dr. Peter Park and the LSU OMS department to enact positive changes within the Department and afford the Residents the best possible experience.

Our current financial status as of the end of July is as follows:

We currently have \$2,002,222.73 in the Investment account and an additional \$327,286.83 in our checking account for a total of \$2,329,509.56.

Three of the four residents that graduated this past June successfully completed the ABOMS Qualifying Exam (formally known as the written exam) in their last year of residency. As resolved by the Board of Directors at a Zoom meeting earlier this year, these three residents were reimbursed for the cost of the exam. It is hoped that this will encourage our graduating residents to take the exam in their last year and be well on their way to Board Certification during their first year in practice.

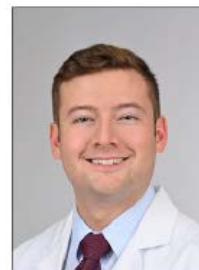

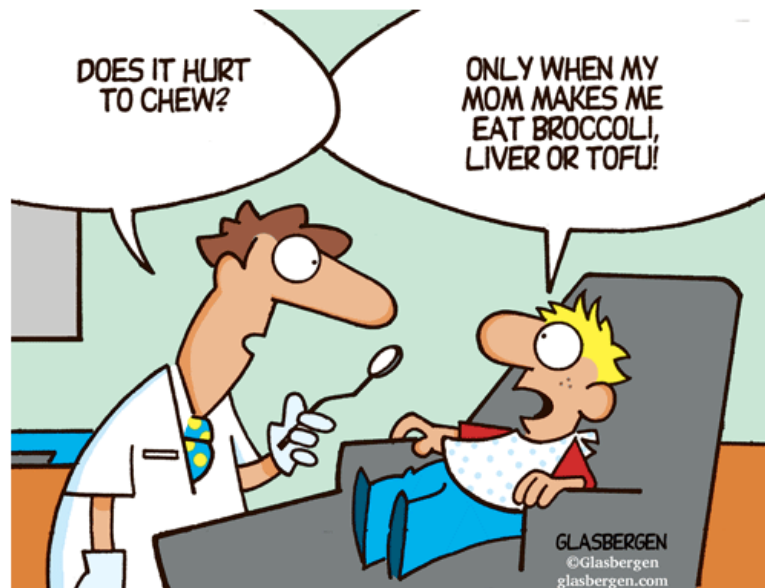

Here are the specifics:

- Donors must be age 70 ½ or older at the time the gift is made.
- Donors must request a direct transfer of funds to a qualified public charity.
It is important not to withdraw the funds before making a gift.
- Gifts cannot be used to fund a gift annuity or charitable remainder trust.
- Each donor may give up to \$100,000 per year.
